The design also includes the ability to accommodate other Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) and in the future partnership with other emergency service providers that will lower overhead costs. Construction is planned to begin in fall of 2021 with a planned launch date of the new 911 Center in late 2022 or early 2023. Chief Clerk/County Administrator Jamie Wolgemuth noted that this will be the most expensive project in the County's history. The County had funds on hand to secure the land but the rest of the funds will come from borrowing.

The meeting opened with Observance of a Moment of Silence and the Pledge to the Flag.

The Commissioners asked for public comment. John and Ellie Sallahub of North Cornwall Township read the following statement on hate for inclusion in the commissioner minutes.

We happen to be white, live in Lebanon County, and use our property frontage to display signage that represents our positions on social, political and environmental issues. Under our past provocative leadership, we became alarmed by the acceptance, encouragement, and proliferation of racism, hate and violence in our country. We chose to display Black Lives Matter and Martin Luther King signs along with our Biden/Harris banner. As a result, we have been experiencing passers by shouting profanities and making vulgar gestures at us and our property on almost a daily basis. These hateful expressions escalated to a premeditated act of arson at 8:42 pm on Monday, 16 November 2020, when individuals conspired and burned a raccoon at the end of our driveway near our Martin Luther King sign. From video footage, a truck stops in front our property, a person runs to our driveway and almost immediately flames flare up several feet, close to our wooden fence and a tree. The individual quickly runs away and jumps into the bed of the truck and the driver speeds off. When the flames subsided, we were horrified to see a raccoon had obviously been doused with a flammable fluid and ignited. We are shocked that our community 'neighbors' would attack us in this way for their blatant racist message. According to the FBI, "A hate crime is a traditional offense like murder, arson, or vandalism with an added element of bias. For the purposes of collecting statistics, the FBI has defined a hate crime as a "criminal offense against a person or property motivated in whole or part by an offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity." Hate crimes are the highest priority of the FBI's civil rights program because of the devastating impact they have on families and communities. We are especially concerned for the safety and wellbeing of our fellow community members who have been burdened for so long by racism and bigotry and fear of violence. Common sense and common decency dictate that mutual respect and acceptance must prevail if we are to live, work and thrive together. We cannot tolerate this type of crime here in Lebanon County – or anywhere else. Overt acts of racism must be unequivocally denounced by our elected public officials, community leaders, and each one of us. Justice demands that ordinary citizens speak out. Hate and bigotry can only propagate when good people stay silent. If anyone has been victimized by discrimination or a perceived hate-crime, please contact the PA State Human Relations Board and report the incident by calling 717-772-0523 or file a discrimination complaint.

It serves as a tribute to the fallen men and women who perished on September 11, 2001.

The multipurpose trail system provides cyclists, hikers and walkers a valued public resource and an opportunity to experience breathtaking landscapes, meet new towns and engage with the unique historic qualities of the communities and sites along the route. Through the efforts of The September 11th Trail Alliance, along with cooperation of local and state governments, assistance of federal agencies, the C&O Canal, and the Great Allegheny Passage, the Schuylkill River Greenways and many more defined by a series of state wide routing studies completed in 2015, the current routing is defined and can be seen on <a href="https://www.911trail.org">www.911trail.org</a>.

The September Eleventh National Memorial Trail (9-11NMT) is currently both off road trail with interconnecting roadways. It connects New York City, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Washington DC, Virginia and West Virginia. It is a system of trails and roads that creates a triangle that is approximately 1,300 miles in length; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Lebanon of the State of Pennsylvania joins with six others states and the District of Columbia through which the 911NMT runs; and

While in Vietnam, John became a member of the elite DUSTOFF (Dedicated Unhesitating Service to Our Fighting Forces) rescue team; and

**WHEREAS**, On Oct. 13, 1971, John was the first pilot on a DUSTOFF mission in far western An Giang Province and, for reasons unknown, he and his crew were apparently unaware that they had drifted south and were dangerously close to Dop Chompa, a 2,330-feet high peak. The helicopter hit the side of the mountain and burst into flames, killing all aboard; and

**WHEREAS**, John was awarded the Purple Heart, six Air Medals, National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and Aviator Badge for his meritorious service. He also received the Vietnam Campaign Medal from the Republic of Vietnam; and

The meeting opened with Observance of a Moment of Silence and the Pledge to the Flag.

The Commissioners asked for public comment. Colonel Lane Marshall, Fort Indiantown Gap (FITG) Commander and David Weisnicht, Deputy Base Operations Manager recapped the construction of the West Gate, Visitor's Center, Emergency Services Building, Police/Fire Department and the Youth Challenge Academy. In 2021, troops trained were 118,000, which is a slight decrease from previous years. The difference is that troops stayed on base longer, which raised the number of training days. Colonel Marshall asked Commissioners for a letter of support, due to a proposed windmill project that could affect the aviator training at the Eastern Aviation School at Fort Indiantown Gap, which is the second-busiest heliport in the country with almost 7,000 flights per year. Marshall fears if the proposed windmill project moves forward just north of the base, in Schuylkill County, it would cut into part of the buffer zone that the Gap relies on to maximize it's training capabilities safely, due to the height of the windmills. Colonel Marshall also announced that he is retiring with 36 years of service.
