Do you understand that the right to a jury trial means that you, together with your attorney, can participate in the selection of a jury; that a jury consists of 12 people selected at random from the citizens of Lebanon County; at that trial you have the right to confront and cross-examine all of the Commonwealth's witnesses in your case who are necessary to prove your guilt; and that the jury has to agree unanimously that you are guilty beyond a reasonable doubt before you can be convicted of the crime or crimes with which you are charged; and do you understand you are presumed to be innocent until found guilty?

15. Do you understand that the Commonwealth has the burden of proving you guilty beyond a reasonable doubt, which means you can remain silent and nothing can be held against you for refusing to testify in your own defense and the jury will be so instructed? Yes___ No___

27. After you enter your guilty plea and it is accepted by the Court, you still have a right to appeal your conviction to the Superior Court within 30 days after the date of sentencing. The appeal of a guilty plea is limited, however, to four grounds. They are:
- a. that your guilty plea was not knowing, intelligent and voluntary;
 - b. that the Court did not have jurisdiction to accept your plea (in other words, the crime or crimes for which you are pleading guilty did not occur in Lebanon County);
 - c. that the Court's sentence is beyond the maximum penalty authorized by law; and
 - d. that your attorney was ineffective in representing you.

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28. You have the following rights: after sentencing you have (10) days within which to file two motions, which may be combined: the first is a challenge to the validity of your guilty plea, or the denial of a motion to withdraw your guilty plea if you file one before sentencing; the second is a challenge to the propriety of your sentence or sentences, or requesting modification of it or them. "Propriety of sentence" refers to whether or not the sentencing judge considered all the appropriate and requisite factors in determining the sentence or sentences imposed. If the Court denies either or both motions you may appeal to the Superior Court within (30) days after the date of that denial.

The "10 days motions" must be in writing and only claims or reasons set forth therein would be considered by us and preserved for review by the Superior Court. Claims not raised here will not be heard by the Superior Court. You are entitled to counsel to assist you in filing these motions and appeals and if you are unable to afford counsel, one would be appointed for you, upon your application, to represent you free of charge.
